# RANGER ROUND UP

#### From the Principal's Desk

As we prepare for the weather to change and make our way into this winter, we have some reminders for parents and students regarding a few procedures and expectations. First, please make sure that students have their ID with them each day and that they are wearing it so staff can see it. Kids will begin wearing winter coats and more layers and it's important that their ID is visible to enter the building and that it is worn throughout the day. The next key reminder is regarding students arriving at school on time. Please plan ahead as the weather begins to deteriorate. We find that during inclement weather, more students are driven to school, creating longer waits with traffic. We will do our best to move the lines along and we appreciate everyone's cooperation as we work together to get our kids into the school.

The final reminder is regarding our drop-off and pick up procedures around the building. To keep our students safe, be respectful of our neighbors, and move traffic efficiently, please follow these driving procedures:

#### Drop- Off Procedures

- Leave early, especially during inclement weather. Students should enter the building before 7:50 a.m. We open doors at 7:15 and there is less traffic earlier in the morning.
- Students being dropped off at school should be in the front of the building in the far-right lane of the Franklin drive-through. please avoid the south parking lot behind the building and the Rec parking lot.
- 3. Only students arriving in the school vans and students with disabilities are permitted to use the south side of Robinwood behind the school. Students may walk down Robinwood to enter the rear of the building.
- 4. Students should never be dropped off on Robinwood or neighboring streets, and cars are not permitted to turn around in the residents' driveways. Robinwood is a permit-only street which may result in traffic tickets for those not in compliance. This is also dangerous and not respectful of our neighbors' property.
- 5. Set expectations that when the flow of traffic stops in the driveway, students should exit the car at that point and walk to Door 32. This is extremely helpful in moving the line faster and will move you through the drop-off sooner.
- 6. Be prepared to unload and load quickly. The faster we exit the car, the faster we all move forward.

- Please be patient. In general, it takes less than 30 seconds for cars to unload and begin to pull out of the lane. Waiting patiently is far better than creating a situation where a student could be injured.
- 8. Be kind and respectful to all of our drivers.

#### Pick Up Procedures

- 1. All cars picking up students will line up in the front of the school in the Franklin drive-through.
- 2. Cars should not pick up by the gym doors or rec entrance.
- 3. Cars should not pick up in the back of the school on Robinwood or neighboring streets. In addition, cars are not permitted to turn around in the residents' driveways. This is dangerous and not respectful of our neighbors' property.

Thank you for making the effort to revisit these policies and keep them in mind as we turn the corner into the winter months.





**Dance Choreography:** Solo and ensemble works of all dance styles are accepted. Entrant must be the choreographer and may also be the performer, or one of the performers. If background music is used, cite it on the entry form. **Video** file must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size and be in MP4, MOV, or AVI format.

**Film Production:** Accepted short film styles include: Animation, narrative, documentary, experimental or media presentation. Use of PowerPoint is prohibited. Entrant must be the screenwriter, cinematographer, editor and producer. If background music is used, cite it on the entry form. **Video** file must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size and be in MP4, MOV, or AVI format.

**Literature**: Accepted forms of fiction and nonfiction include: Prose, poetry, reflective essay, screen play and play script, narrative, and short story. Entrants may write in their primary language as long as an interpretive English translation is also attached. Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. **Writing** must not exceed 2,000 words and may be handwritten or typed. Accepted formats: Single-sided print on 8 ½x11" paper, PDF file.

**Music Composition:** All music styles and combinations of instrumentation are accepted. Entrant must be the composer and may also be the performer, or one of the performers. Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. An audio recording of the composition must be included and must not exceed 5 minutes in length and 1,000 MB (1,000 megabyte) in file size. Accepted audio file formats include: MP3 and WAV. **Notation** (score/tablature) in PDF format is only required for middle and high school divisions. In place of a notated score entrant may include a written reflective statement that provides a musically technical explanation of how you wrote the music (100 words or less).

**Photography:** Photo must be a single print/digital image. Collages and collections of photos are not accepted. Entrant must be the photographer and may use a variety of digital editing techniques including but not

limited to, multiple exposure, negative sandwich and photogram. Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. **Print** image dimensions must be no smaller than 3x5 inches and no larger than 8x10 inches. Accepted print formats: Mounted on mat or poster board no larger than 11x14 inches. Framed prints are not accepted. **Digital** image dimensions must be at least 640x960 (pixels) and 300 dpi (resolution). Accepted file formats: JPEG, JPG, and PNG.

**Visual Arts:** Works of both fine and design arts are accepted, including but not limited to: architectural drawing and models, ceramics, collage, computer generated images and graphics, crafts, drawing, fashion clothes and jewelry, fiber work, mixed media, painting, printmaking and sculpture. Use of copyrighted material is prohibited. **2D** artworks must be mounted on sturdy material and no larger than 24x30 inches with matting. Framed entries are not accepted. Include one digital image of artwork with your submission. **3D** artwork submissions must contain 3 digital images of artwork at different angles. Image(s) are used for artwork identification, judging and exhibition purposes. Accepted file formats: JPEG, JPG, and PNG.

**Special Artist:** Students who identify as having a disability and may receive services under IDEA or ADA: Section 504 may enter in the Special Artist Division **or** grade division most closely aligned to their functional abilities.
